Meet the 2016 Awardees

Each year as I travel the country and the world, I meet so many people committed to mentoring young men to change the directions of their lives. CEOS is committed to acknowledging this most important work that most often goes unnoticed and thus unrecognized. This year, we are pleased to have been able to acknowledge four honorees for "paying it forward" to help this generation and generations to come. They, like others, have given of their time, talent, and resources to help young men and boys plan a future that is different from their past. As we recognize their work, we want to inspire you, our readers, to join them in this most important and overlooked area of work.

The three individual honorees for 2016 are: Dr. Winsome Gordon, Mr. Robert Jackson, and Corporal Stephen Pacheco, Jr. The fourth award went to an organization—UMAC/Tutoring Café through its founder and CEO, Juan Davis.

MR. ROBERT JACKSON was bullied and mistreated as a youth because of his stand against participating in unlawful activities. He often arrived at school shaken and bloodied without a query from teachers or administrators. Through hard work, determination, participation in sports, faith in God and attention to academics he slowly but surely changed his circumstances. Drafted by the Minnesota Vikings his NFL Career was short lived due to a major injury but not his life's goal. He turned to teaching and has had a successful career as teacher, consultant, author, motivator and mentor.

Mr. Jackson is married to "TJ" Butler and together they have three children. He mentors over 200 young men and women. He is a graduate of Western Kentucky University with a B.S in Industrial Technology

CEOS salutes Mr. Jackson for the outstanding leadership he has offered to, role model he has been for, and change agent he has for children generally and boys in particular. "His passion for issues facing young men is contagious and his efforts are tireless."

DR. WINSOME GORDON, OD, J.P. is truly an international figure who has had a tremendous impact on the world in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, Europe and India. After training and initial work in her homeland of Jamaica, Dr. Gordon completed her terminal degree and returned to work in the Ministry of Education as an Assistant Chief Education Officer in charge of Planning Research and Statistics.

She later joined the staff of the National Planning Institute from which vantage point she came in contact with and was invited to join UNESCO and spent the next twenty years impacting Africa, Asia, Europe and the Caribbean especially in education for girls and women.

Dr. Gordon returned to Jamaica in 2008 and was recruited to serve as a leader in the National Education System Transformation Program. It was from this vantage point that she began to advocate for the education of boys in Jamaica to redress their under-education issuesinitiating programs to facilitate their education. With her colleagues she worked with teachers identify and remove undermined obstacles that effectiveness of teachers and to understand how to engage boys in the learning process since "teachers are at the core of education for all."

Presently, Dr. Gordon is the Chief Executive Officer of the Jamaica Teaching Council. She is intent on her purpose of making transformation of boys a national priority and on doing all to see its accomplishment.
